What is a Coordinated Response Team?

We acknowledge domestic violence and abuse are significant issues and we strive to protect those in need, advocate for justice, and collaborate as a cohesive team. We meet monthly to review our response to domestic abuse & violence cases and find ways to improve and increase community awareness of this issue.

Who is part of the CCR team?

Members include Abuse Resource Network & Therapy (ARN), law enforcement officers, nurses and hospital staff, emergency medical services, public health leaders, and prosecutors. We are committed to improving our community and creating an environment where everyone feels safe and respected.

What is domestic abuse?

Domestic abuse, also known as intimate partner violence and coercive control, is an ongoing pattern of behaviors and abusive tactics used by an intimate partner or ex-partner to maintain power and control over a person's life. These tactics include physical abuse, psychological abuse, verbal abuse, financial or economic abuse and controlling or coercive behavior.
